Families were invited to light a candles and share anything on their hearts as we prayed for their children. Some chose to share their journey through loss. Others offered words of encouragement or prayers that were helpful or gave some solace. While the night is deeply somber, there is also great hope for children who only knew perfect love. Here is a beautiful reflection written by St. Francis De Sales that one family shared:

The everlasting God has, in His wisdom, foreseen from eternity the cross that He now presents to you as a gift from His inmost heart. This cross He now sends you He has considered with His all-knowing eyes, understood with His divine mind, tested with His wise justice, warmed with loving arms, and weighed with His own hands to see that it be not one inch too large and not one ounce too heavy for you.

He has blessed it with His holy Name, anointed it with His consolation, taken one last glance at you and your courage, and then sent it to you from heaven, a special greeting from God to you, an alms of the all-merciful love of God.

This prayer service is a part of Divine Mercy Care's mission to witness to the value of life at conception, the need for trained medical teams to support families experiencing loss, and the importance of continued support for these parents. Helping Women Affected by Hurricane Helene

McKenzie Chasteen is a new nurse midwife at Tepeyac OB/GYN. She is originally from Boone, North Carolina. Her parents still live there and support a local pregnancy resource organization, **The Hope Center**. The mountain town was, like many in the region, devastated by Hurricane Helene. Rapid flooding caused significant damage and left many without work or access to resources. The staff at The Hope Center shared that they have limited space to store donated items, but donations are always helpful.

The Hope Center is working to get resources to mothers and families in need. They shared the story of Brianna, a mother to two precious twins who are almost two years old. They unfortunately lost their home and most of their belongings due to Hurricane Helene. She has also been out of work due to the hurricane and cannot keep up with her monthly

expenses while caring for her family. Hope's benevolence fund is used for clients like Brianna who have financial needs due to a recent hardship or unforeseen circumstance.
